The first order of business was to organize the Board for the ensuing year. It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to elect Howard Erdmann as Chairman of the Board for the ensuing year, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote - Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - Abstained. Majority voting "yes" the motion carried. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to elect Eldon Ehrman as Vice-Chairman of the Board for the ensuing year, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - yes, Ehrman - abstained. Majority voting "yes" the motion carried.

Sheriff, Larry Gessner, met with the board to discuss the City/County Policing Contract for 2005. The Salvation Army is looking for volunteers and a potluck supper/meeting is scheduled to be held at the City Hall in a couple weeks. Some criminal issues were discussed briefly. Gessner reviewed estimates of repairing the Bronco on miscellaneous items of over \$3,000.00 with labor. Purchasing a 2003 Ford Explorer from the Salt Lake County Fleet Dept. with low mileage was discussed. Leasing a vehicle will be investigated further and Gessner will report back later in the day. A forum on alcohol compliance will be held Jan 26th & 27th in Bismarck that will be sponsored by the Dept of Transportation. The Commissioners were recommended to attend.

At this time the board reviewed the Courthouse boiler equipment and its operation with Kim Hrichena, Chemsearch, Minot, and the Courthouse custodian, Sylvia Schell. Kim tested the boiler water and that there is a rust issue that is deteriorating the boiler equipment and its efficiency operation. A nitrate chemical treatment program is recommended to discontinue the rust from forming so the steam can run through the registers more evenly. Hrichena recommended insulating pipes to not lose heat in the boiler room for better efficiency also, and to install a feed water tank for when water levels are low to automatically fill water in the Boiler. The chemical treatment program will run around \$1,500.00 the first year including the self injection pump. The following year the nitrate chemical treatment program should run around \$1,000.00 per year. Testing the boiler water can be done on an annual basis through Chemsearch to see if chemical use can be reduced. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve the Boiler chemical treatment program as recommended by Hrichena and sign the agreement to that affect, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

The time being 11:00 a.m. the County Park Board meeting was held. The County Commission meeting reconvened at 11:30 a.m.

Sheriff, Larry Gessner, met with the board to review vehicle lease interest rates. Robert Sorensen, First National Bank, met with the board upon the boards request to inquire about auto vehicle interest

rates to lease a 2003 Ford Explorer through the First National Bank. Sorensen will investigate further and return with information in the afternoon.

Cynthia Wahl, Tax Director, met with the board to report on a class she attended on the detailed soils procedure that other Counties have followed. A public hearing will need to be held later to set the modifiers. Crop and noncrop values were discussed. A detailed soils committee meeting will be held in Wells County to start their public meetings. The Commissioners were recommended to attend this meeting. A soils committee will need to be organized in Sheridan County. A landowner from each township was recommended to be appointed. The appointed soils committee members will be contacted and asked to attend the Wells County soils committee meeting with the County Commissioners to get a better understanding of the detailed soils procedure for tax valuation purposes.

Crystal Schaunaman, County Agent, and Mike Hanson, NDSU District Director, met with the board to report on issues and activities within the Extension Office. The Food and Nutrition Program position was discussed and the different alternatives of hiring the FNP position. NDSU will advertise for the FNP position. The Food and Nutrition Program position minimum requirement is to have a high school diploma. Shirley Jorgensen was appointed for input on discussing the 4-H agent and FNP position with Schaunaman and Hanson at a later date.

The time being 2:00 p.m. the hearing on the application for abatement of 2002 and 2003 taxes filed by Frieda Wahl on the SW4 Section 11-146-77 was held. Freida Wahl was present and reported that 45.50 acres of her land is under water and that the T & F value for 2002 should be decreased down to 16,450 from 25,770 and the 2003 T & F value should be decreased down to 15,640 from 24,450. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve the abatement as requested due to many acres of inundated land, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes, All voting "yes" the motion carried.

The Auditor reported that the NDSU Value per acre was reported for Sheridan County to be decreased by 1.7% for 2005. The board approved no changes be made being we are still within the 5% tolerance allowed by State.

The time being 2:30 p.m. the hearing on the application for abatement of 2004 taxes requesting 100% Homestead Credit was filed by Herman and Olivia Bertsch for on Lots 16-17-18, Block 4, McClusky City was held at this time. The application was reviewed and eligibility guidelines were met. There being no objections heard, it was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to approve the Bertsch application for abatement of 2004 taxes allowing 100% Homestead Credit, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote - Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann -yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to approve the computer technical support services contract with NDACo for 2005 in the annual amount of \$4,080.00, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote: Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen -yes, Erdmann -yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

The Auditor reported the 2004 General Election cost per vote was \$5.83 per vote. A decrease of \$9.24 per vote from the June Primary Election due to more voter turnout in the General Election.

The time being 3:00 p.m. the hearing on the application for abatement of 2002 and 2003 taxes of Allan Tinker on several parcels in Harris Twp. was held. Allan and Brian Tinker were present. Also present was Dave Martwick. Tax Director, Cynthia Wahl, reported that the value on the property of Allan Tinker was increased and decreased across the board on all agriculture land, not just on noncropland and that is where the County's calculations differ from Brian Tinker's calculations. The State has directed the Counties to follow the agriculture value per acre of agricultural lands on a County wide basis as computed for the given year by the Agribusiness and Applied Economics Department of the ND State University, not just on noncropland or cropland values separated out and the County's computer system does not separate cropland and noncropland values on the same parcel. Ehrman stated that values are increased and decreased on all agriculture values in Sheridan County and everyone will be treated fairly this way until the detailed soils data will be the base of tax valuation in the near future. Brian Tinker reviewed a spreadsheet of an example of noncropland values only, separated out with the increases and decreases of values throughout a ten year period. The Board stated they will make their decision on the 2002 and 2003 applications for abatement later in the day.

The time being 3:30 p.m. the discount tank wagon fuel bid letting was held. Bids were received as follows:

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to accept the Gasoline and Heating Fuel discount tank wagon price of .07 per gal. off the retail price from the CO-OP Elevator for 2005, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

Alvin Gross, Road Foreman, met with the board to request purchase of paint to finish the walls in the County shop and insulation for the ceiling and big door of the County Shop. It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to approve that Gross purchase paint and insulation for the County Shop, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Roll call vote: Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried. Gross was instructed to schedule the road crew to remove the old coal hopper and auger out of the Courthouse basement being it will not be used again.

Myron Dieterle, landowner, met with the board to request purchase of County owned land that is adjoining his property in the SW4 8-149-76 consisting of 1.42 acres. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve Dieterle to purchase the 1.42 acres for \$1.00 being the strip of land is no longer used for road right of way, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call vote: Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

Robert Sorensen, First National Bank, met with the board to discuss a vehicle loan through the First National Bank at 6% interest for the government rate. Sorensen reported that a Certificate of Indebtedness could possibly be done also. Further counsel with the Attorney General's Office is being investigated on a Certificate of Indebtedness. No action was taken at this time.

A contact was made by speakerphone to the Choice Financial Bank, Goodrich, on vehicle loan interest rates. Karen Konschak, Choice Financial Bank, will follow up with more information at a later date.

The Boiler Insurance Policy for 2005 was reviewed and approved.

The Quarterly narrative for Oct-Dec from Verona Lechler, Home Economist, on 4-H Youth and Family Nutrition Programs was reviewed and approved.

After serious consideration, it was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve only the four parcels #2160-10, 2171, 2177, and 2179 of Allen Tinker's property in Harris Twp for 2002 T & F Value to decrease from 56,610 down to 39,376 and 2003 T & F Value to decrease from 53,690 down to 35,938 being there was a change in use of the land from prior years from cropland to non-cropland just on these parcels and not the other parcels requesting abatement, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen -yes, Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman that the District County Assessors be paid \$275.00 per township for assessor duties for 2005, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman, and carried that the Chairman of the Board, Howard Erdmann, the County Auditor, and the County Treasurer, be appointed the members of the purchasing board for the ensuing year, 2005. Upon roll call - Erdmann -yes, Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried. The County Officials and Janitor are therefore requested to requisition to the Board of County Commissioners at their regular meetings for all larger items such as furniture, equipment, etc. that exceeds over \$100.00 and that they have the approval of the purchasing board on all smaller items.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen, and carried that the Auditor be authorized to pay the following items by Auditor's warrants during the year upon authorized payrolls, certificates of interest on warrants, workmen compensation premiums, unemployment insurance, withholding tax, welfare office personnel, other welfare vouchers upon approval of welfare board, and county shop, county park, and courthouse electricity and water bills. Upon roll call - Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes, Jorgensen - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen, that the following banks be designated as County Depository Banks. Upon roll call vote: Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.
