Chairman County Equalization Meeting June 2, 2015

The Sheridan County Board of Equalization met at 2:00 p.m. Members present were County Commissioners Howard Erdmann and Steven Eisenbeisz. Absent: Michael Axt Others present were: Cynthia Wahl, Tax Director; James Haux, Twp. Assessor; Jeffrey Martwick, Twp. Assessor; Gable Rhoads, McClusky Gazette reporter; Brian Larson and Kendon Faul, McClusky Co-op Elevator Manager and employee; Tom Saueressig, landowner; and Janice Erdmann, acting County Treasurer.

Chairman Erdmann called the meeting to order.

The first order of business was the equalization of residential property. The residential assessments as returned by the assessors and local boards were reported by the County Auditor for a total taxable valuation of 658,233. An increase of 4% from last year. The sales ratio came in at 99.1% so Sheridan County is within the state tolerance. Tom Saueressig inquired about his residence being assessed. Wahl indicated Saueressig worked off the farm as a construction worker before his new structure was moved on his property and being he cash rents his land which is considered off the farm income also, according to state law that makes him ineligible for farm exemption of their residential structure. Auditor Murray reported a couple of omitted properties were missed and still need to be assessed in Prophets and Denhoff twps. The residential and commercial properties will be finalized at the 2:00 p.m. July 7<sup>th</sup> reconvened County Equalization meeting.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> order of business was the equalization of commercial property. The commercial assessments as returned by the assessors and local boards were reported by the County Auditor for a total taxable valuation of 400,501. An increase of 7% from last year. The sales ratio came in right at 100%. Kendon Faul and Brian Larson inquired why the McClusky Co-op Elevator anhydrous tanks at the Denhoff junction parcel are valued so high. One tank is 18,000 gallons and the other tank is 15,000 gallons. James Haux, Denhoff Twp. Assessor will investigate further with the depreciation cost percentage for each year and respond back at the July 7<sup>th</sup> reconvened equalization meeting. No action was taken on commercial properties until the July meeting.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> order of business was the equalization of agricultural property. The ND State Tax Commissioner's office calculations requested Sheridan County to increase the ag values by 17.7%. At the January 7<sup>th</sup> meeting the County Commissioners only increased ag values by 7% to wait and see how the County Equalization values came in at to determine if more of an increase in ag values would be needed. The total taxable acres in Sheridan County are at 551,005.11 with a total taxable value of \$11,262,875 that included the 7% increase. The average per acre value is now at \$408.80 or 9% within the state's 10% state tolerance. The state's average per acre value for Sheridan County is set at \$446.33. Everyone was given the opportunity to be heard. It was moved by Commissioner Eisenbeisz to approve the ag values as filed in the Auditor's office, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Eisenbeisz – yes, Erdmann – yes Motion carried.

One Veteran Service Credit and Twelve Senior Citizen Homestead Credit applications were filed as per assessors submitted. It was moved by Commissioner Eisenbeisz, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann that the applications be approved as returned by the assessors. Upon roll call – Eisenbeisz – yes, Erdmann – yes motion carried.

The Auditor reported the State School Lands in lieu of tax abstract of 2,395.82 acres that are leased for crop or hay was also increased by 7% for a total of 897,559 True & Full value. The ND Game & Fish Dept. in lieu of tax abstract of 28,183.14 acres was also increased by the 7% for a total of 9,165,244 True & Full value. The Non-profit organizations (Ducks Unlimited and Nature Conservancy) abstract of 10,266.84 acres was also increased by 7% for a total of 3,237,900 of which each organization still receives a tax statement and pays taxes. It was moved by Commissioner Eisenbeisz to approve the in lieu of tax abstract values as filed in the Auditor's office, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Eisenbeisz – yes, Erdmann – yes Motion carried.

The Auditor reported the total County taxable value with estimated utilities would be \$12,304,650 or \$12,304.65 per mill and one mill is worth \$500.50 more than last year.

Herb Bargmann, Wold Engineering, met with the board to discuss purchasing right of way and construction easement acres from land owners along the 5 miles north farm to market road from McClusky. One inch of pavement will be milled off of current pavement, widening the grade and some hills will be cut down north of McClusky. State bidding will be on just a little over 4 miles with a possible change order for next year to add 1-2 miles with the  $2^{nd}$  state funding surge monies that will first be released next year. Bargmann also presented the board options for the Martin south pavement repair – Option 1 – one ft. of gravel, base stabilizer with double chip seal 1,200 ft project - \$100,000 Option 2 – one ft. of gravel, fabric with 5" of asphalt 1,200 ft. project - \$225,000.
