## County Commission Meeting May 3, 2016

The Board of Sheridan County Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. Commissioners present were Steve Eisenbeisz and Howard Erdmann. Absent: Michael Axt Others present were: Sandy Blanes, McClusky Gazette reporter

Chairman Eisenbeisz called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meetings were read and a correction of the April 13<sup>th</sup> meeting in the motion of the County Treasurer submitting a bill after attending the tax classes will be paid should read to be considered to be paid.

Trent Naser, Sheriff, called in by speakerphone being he was out of state, to discuss a service animal being allowed in the courthouse. Naser requested the board to advise his office how to further handle the service animal situation while he was gone. Sandy Blanes, reporter for the Gazette stated she has an article ready to be published on all the info on service animals. The Auditor reported that the Sheriff's rental bldg. for storing items for investigations, etc. has changed ownership and that the rental agreement will stay the same, however; a lot of rent has been paid out since 2004. Discussion on thinking about other options by next month's meeting will be considered before a new rental agreement is signed.

The time being 11:00 a.m. the County Park Board meeting was held. The County Commission meeting reconvened at 11:45 a.m.

Michael Axt was present at this time. Herb Bargmann, Wold Engineering, met with the board to report that the utility companies had a meeting together this morning on the north McClusky road

project to report on moving the utilities where the engineering plans indicate. Bargmann reported the north McClusky road project will always have a one way traffic lane open. It was moved by Commissioner Erdmann to authorize the auditor's office to make payments to Knife River Materials upon approval from Wold Engineering, Inc. for the north McClusky road project, seconded by Commissioner Eisenbeisz. Upon roll call vote – Erdmann – yes, Eisenbeisz – yes, Axt – yes Motion carried.

Commissioner Axt reported that John Halcrow has requested more approaches to be installed by his property in New Johns Lake twp. and also certain speeding limit signs should be posted being the road splits his farmyard. The States Attorney will be contacted to see what sign regulations are required.

Doug Straus, G & R Controls, met with the board to present a maintenance plan for just the air conditioning controls in the amount of 2,585.00 per year for a two year agreement. Straus also proposed a controlling system to enable/disable the electric and oil boilers by sensors connected to the current Siemens BAS system to maintain steam pressure and consistent heat in the amount of 15,500.00. It was moved by Commissioner Axt to approve the maintenance plan and approve the proposed controlling system tying the electric and oil boilers together by this fall with part of the payment then and remaining payment after the  $1^{st}$  of next year, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Axt – yes, Erdmann – yes, Eisenbeisz – yes Motion carried.

Nicole Wardner and Annie Fylling met with the board to present the resignation of Annie Fylling, County Agent Clerk. It was moved by Commissioner Axt to approve the resignation of Annie Fylling, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote -Axt - yes, Erdmann - yes, Eisenbeisz - yes Motion carried. An ad will be advertised in McClusky Gazette for the clerk position in the next two weeks with May 20<sup>th</sup> being closing date of accepting applications. Interviews will be held the week of May 23<sup>rd</sup> with wages starting between \$10.00 -\$12.00 per hr. depending on experience. Wardner reported on some of the upcoming events/ programs that will be held thru the extension office.

Wayne Houston, Emergency Manager, met with the board upon their request to report on the County Hazard Mitigation program that is currently being conducted and that a quarterly bill from Wenck Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$6,200.00 was presented for payment for conducting the County Hazard Mitigation Plan Program that will be paid by a FEMA grant from the ND Dept. of Emergency Services. Houston also reported there was a rural 911 phone call made that could not go thru on a cell phone and is being investigated why.

Alvin Gross, road foreman, met with the board to discuss graveling farm to market roads. A letter was received from Glen Schneider, landowner, adjoining the County Shop in Goodrich requesting the County to still repair the shared fence. Gross will work on it as their schedule allows. More gravel pits were discussed to be crushed. The Auditor reported the new culvert prices were increased by 3-4% from True North Steel, Fargo, ND. The road restrictions will be taken off this week. The Auditor also reported the State DOT office inquired about the farm to market Pickard Twp. detours sites if either of the roads are coming out of the inundated water yet and requested to place more gravel on detour sites. These sites will be graveled this week yet Gross stated.

Kathy Mindt and Sylvia Schell met with the board to report that Lynnette Fox will issue marriage licenses. It was moved by Commissioner Eisenbeisz to designate Lynnette Fox as the officer to issue the marriage licenses for Sheridan County, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Eisenbeisz – yes, Erdmann – yes, Axt – yes Motion carried.

The abatement filed by Ralph Volson for 2014 and 2015 tax years for on Part of E2 SW4, Part of Lots 6-7 6-146-75 were reviewed and the hearing was set for Tuesday, June 7<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

It was moved Commissioner Axt to approve the 2017-2019 biennium funding agreement with the ND Supreme Court for cost share of the Clerk of Court Office, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Axt – yes, Erdmann – yes, Eisenbeisz – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Axt to appoint Jeanette Bonnet as Election Inspector for 2016 Elections, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote – Axt – yes, Erdmann – yes, Eisenbeisz – yes Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
