Cynthia Wahl, Tax Director, met with the board to report on the detailed soils project. Interstate Engineering provided County data in November and will need to come back in January to show the Auditor, Tax Director, and Treasurer's office how to polygram and snap parcels together. Cynthia Wahl will start 4/5 time after the $1^{\rm st}$ of year, Monday thru Thursday 9:00-5:00 at \$1,080.00 per month salary to work on the detailed soils project.

The County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park meeting. The County Commission Meeting reconvened at 1:00 P.M.

Judy Beaudry, Equitable, met with the board to discuss term life insurance for County employees through Met Life. An employee meeting with NDPERS and Judy Beaudry, Equitable, will be schedule in December.

Greg O' Shea, Butler Machinery, met with the board to wish Seasons Greetings.

Ed Baker, Road Foreman, met with the board to report that he will be off work for 4 weeks or so for back surgery after December $12^{\rm th}$.

Wold Engineering met with the board to also wish

Jeffrey Martwick, Hi-Way Lounge, met with the board to present applications for his 2003 Liquor & beer license. It was moved by Commissioner Erdmann to approve that a liquor and beer license be issued to Jeffrey Martwick, Hi-Way Lounge, effective 2003, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote Erdmann - yes, Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

Steve Murray, McClusky City Maintenance, met with the board to inquire on what to do with used County snow blower that is stored in City warehouse. Murray will get specs on the snow blower to the Auditor's office and will later be discussed to be published out on bids.

Casey Erickson, RDO Equipment, met with the board to also wish Seasons Greetings. No word on when the new Motorgrader will be delivered yet.

The Auditor was instructed to advertise for bids on the discount tank wagon price for fuel for the County. Bids will be opened January 7, at 3:00 p.m.

Wayne Houston, Emergency Manager, met with the board to review the Sheridan County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Policy. A map is needed to go with the sites in the County is required by FEMA now. A grant is available through FEMA due by December 16th for cover mapping costs that are to be completed by June 30th. Houston stated the detailed soils mapping can tie into the Emergency mapping. FEMA's share

would be 75% and the County's share is 25% of costs. A County committee is set up to review the mapping sites throughout the County. It was moved by Commissioner Erdmann to authorize the Emergency Manager, Wayne Houston, to apply for a mapping grant from FEMA, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call Erdmann - yes, Jorgensen - yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Erdmann to purchase a 1,000 gallon propane tank for \$250.00 per year for a 5 year term, with first fill of propane at .75 per gallon through Wilton Cenex, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. Upon roll call Erdmann - yes, Ehrman - yes, Jorgensen - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

Larry Gessner, Sheriff, Trent Naser and Richard Bauer, Deputy Sheriff's, met with the board to introduce everyone to the new County Commissioner. Drug problems in the County were discussed. The throttle cable in the deputy sheriff car is broke and will be taken into Eide Ford. Gessner reported a testing center will be conducted for T-1 lines and will be aired on ABC news. The tech center at the EDC office building is progressing. The Bronco windshield is being currently installed and the lightbar will be installed soon also. A new radar system will need to be purchased later on for the Bronco.

Walter Lipp, States Attorney, met with the board upon their request to draw up a proposal to the 4-H council to be presented at the January County Park board meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to adopt a policy that any board members that serve on any County Boards can not miss more than two consecutive Board meetings or else they will be ineligible to serve on a County board effective January 1, 2003, and will be replaced with a new appointment seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote Jorgensen -yes, Erdmann -yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to appoint Gordon O. Felchle to the County Water Resource Board for a 3 year term effective January 1, 2003, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote Ehrman - yes, Erdmann - yes, Jorgensen - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to reappoint Alberta Voegele to the County School Reorganizing Committee for a 3 year term effective January 1, 2003, seconded by Commissioner Erdmann. Upon roll call vote Jorgensen -yes, Erdmann -yes, Ehrman - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to appoint Howard Erdmann to the Planning Commission effective immediately, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call vote Ehrman -yes, Jorgensen - yes, Erdmann - withdrew All voting "yes" the motion carried.

The Vice- Chairman was authorized to sign a contract with ND Youth Correction Center, Mandan, for holding a youth at \$120.00 per day.
