Chairman Felchle called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sheridan County Commissioners, which is the governing body of Sheridan County that in the judge's discretion, to assess a fee as a part of a sentence imposed on a defendant who pleads guilty to or is convicted of a criminal offense for which the maximum penalty that may be imposed by law for the offense includes imprisonment.

The fee assessed is in addition to any fine, penalty, costs or administrative fee prescribed by law. The district judge may assess the fee when sentence is imposed or when sentence is suspended or imposition of sentence is deferred, unless the defendant is indigent and unable to pay the fee.

All fees that have been collected in the past and have been paid to the County must be deposited monthly in the County Treasury and also fees thereon collected. The allocation by the governing body of Sheridan County is to be paid to the Abused Adult Resource Center in Bismarck on a quarterly basis, by the County Treasurer.

All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

Kent Alderin, County Agent, met with the board to report that his office received a new computer from NDSU on a cost share basis and the computer will remain with NDSU's inventory. The new computer was needed due to Annie's A: Drive went out on her old one and the old computer was given back to NDSU being that computer was also purchased on a cost share basis. Also purchased was a Digital camera for different projects it is needed and will be paid out of the Extension Fees fund. Alderin reported on the Home Economist Position will be readvertised with fewer requirements in hopes to interest some applicants being there was no one that applied. Some Weed Control officer and Economic Development issues were discussed. Alderin stated he would be attending a Wetland Trust Conference in Manitoba. January 8-10 and Marketplace is January 11th at he Civic Center in Bismarck.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen that the District County Assessors be paid \$275.00 per township for assessor duties, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen, and carried that the Chairman of the Board, Gordon Felchle, the County Auditor, and the County Treasurer, be appointed the members of the purchasing board for the ensuing year, 2001. The County Officials and Janitor are therefore requested to requisition to the Board of County Commissioners at their regular meetings for all larger items such as furniture, equipment, etc. that exceeds over \$100.00 and that they have the approval of the purchasing board on all smaller items.

COMMISSIONERS MEETING JANUARY 26,2001

The Board of County Commissioners met at 1:15 P.M. on call of the Chairman. Commissioners present were Gordon O. Felchle, Eldon Ehrman, and Shirley J. Jorgensen.

Chairman Felchle called the meeting to order.

Larry Gessner, Sheriff, met with the board to report that the City of McClusky approved to only increase the City/County Police Service Contract to only \$1,200.00 more per year instead of \$2,500.00 per year to bring the annual total up to \$11,200.00 per year. Sheriff Gessner requested if a new radar unit could still be purchased, and if he can still continue to hire a part-time secretary, and also allow an additional \$500.00 to the Narcotic Task Force, and he also stated that Sheriff's Office will cut back in other line items of their 2001 budget. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to grant the request as long as Sheriff's Office does not go over their overall budget for 2001, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. All voting "Aye" the motion carried. Commissioner Ehrman inquired about sharing a police vehicle with police officers that both reside in the same town. Gessner will further investigate if it can be done.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to authorize the Chairman to sign the Police Service Agreement with the City of McClusky in the amount of \$11,200.00 per year, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to approve the following Beer & Liquor License applications along with a letter of recommendations for the year 2001:

Sheyenne Valley Lodge, Inc., rural Goodrich, - On Site Only

Seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

A letter of resignation from Denise Melom, as 2nd District County Assessor, was read and accepted.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to appoint Sherril Houser to fulfill the unexpired term until 2002 of the 2nd District County Assessor position, seconded by Commissioner Ehrman. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

The Auditor reported that the agriculture land values are to increase by 7% according to the State Tax Commissioners Office. It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to only increase to 5% and still be within the 3% tolerance, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.

The Auditor was instructed to bill the organized and unorganized twps. at the remaining \$75.00 per mile for annual maintenance and snow removal for period covering 04-01-01 thru 03-31-02.

Edward Baker, Road Forman, met with the board upon their request to discuss road issues and equipment repairs.

It was moved by Commissioner Erhman to appoint Jim Pellman to serve as an Alternate to the Lewis & Clark CAPITAL Fund Board to fulfill the unexpired term until 02-01-02, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. All voting "Aye" the motion carried.
