The time being 11:00 p.m. the County Park Board meeting was held. The County Commission meeting reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

Casey Erickson, RDO Equipment Co., met with the board upon the board's request to review prices for a used Motorgrader. Erickson will return on October 17th at 11:00 to present motorgrader prices with trade-in considered.

Kent Alderin, County Agent, met with the board to report that the Tourism conference was cancelled in September and will hopefully be rescheduled. The 4-H Council meeting will be held this week. Verona Lechler, Home Extension Agent, has been busy with homemaker projects and 4-H club projects. Economic Development issues were discussed. The EDC bylaws are in the process of being rewritten and the cellular tower will be erected after approval of the Zoning Board. The Tech Resource Center will possibly be looking at hiring some computer resource employees soon.

The Auditor was instructed to receive estimates for a new County Shop furnace.

Ed Baker, Road Foreman, met with the board at this

time. Commissioner Jorgensen instructed the road foreman to look at Johns Lake twp road to check if Capital Electric replaced electric poles. The 1989 Motorgrader repairs were discussed also. No action was taken at this time.

The time being 2:00 p.m. the application for abatement and settlement of taxes filed by Harold & Sylvia Broeckle for on Lease Site# 221401, McClusky City, was considered. The Auditor reported this parcel was duplicated when the Burlington Northern sold parcel to Broeckels and should be cancelled. It was moved by Commissioner Ehrman to approve the abatement due to parcel was duplicated, seconded by Commissioner Jorgensen. Upon roll call Ehrman- yes, Jorgensen - yes, Felchle - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

Greg O'Shea, Butler Machinery, met with the board to discuss used motorgrader estimates. Estimates will be presented at the Special Oct 17th meeting.

The time being 3:00 p.m. the Courthouse used computer bids were opened and raised orally with the highest bid winners as follows:

The County Nurse, Susan Hellman, reported that the Flu shots have increased from \$12.00 to \$15.00 this year.

Larry Gessner, Sheriff, and Trent Naser, Deputy Sheriff, met with the board to report on crime related issues in the County. The Bronco has been delivered to Harvey for engine repairs.

Richard Bauer is at the Police Academy in Bismarck and is doing well with the police training program. Naser just started working last week and will be scheduled for police training in January. Naser's salary will start at \$1,800.00 per mth. Gessner inquired the Board of putting on a Job Development Authority mill levy for support of the Tech Resource Center. The Auditor stated a budget request needs to be presented for next year's budget in July to the County Commission and the County Commission at that time needs to approve a resolution before any Job Development mill levy is added on. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSONERS MEETING October 17, 2002

The Board of County Commissioners met at 10:30 in

special session. Commissioners present were Shirley J.

Jorgensen and Gordon O. Felchle. Absent: Eldon Ehrman

Chairman Felchle called the meeting to order.

Melvin Schindler, McClusky City Mayor, met with the board to discuss the replacement of sidewalk along only the north side of the Old Moore Hotel lots being the County demolished and tore out the sidewalk when the lots were forfeited to the County for back taxes. Discussion of sharing 1/3 of replacement of sidewalk costs with McClusky City and Tinkers was considered. Schindler will discuss further with the McClusky City Council at their November meeting and report back to the County Commission.

Larry Gessner, met with the board to report that the Ford Bronco engine has been repaired and has been delivered. The windshield needs to be repaired yet and estimates for painting will be received.

It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve the Conditional Use application from Commnet Wireless to erect a cellular phone tower in the SW4 24-146-76 as approved by the Planning & Zoning Board, seconded by Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote Jorgensen- yes, Felchle - yes All voting "Yes" the motion carried.

Greg O' Shea, Butler Machinery, met with the board to discuss repairs of 1989 772H Motorgrader. Also discussed was trading in 1989 JD 772BH Motorgrader at \$25,500.00 and 1985 JD 772AH Motorgrader at \$17,500.00 for a new 2002 CAT 143H motorgrader less trade for \$147,550.00. Quotes of a 1995 CAT 140H Motorgrader at \$125,000.00 or 1996 CAT 140H Motorgrader with 1600 hours on at \$128,000.00 were reviewed. Payments could start as far out to January 2004 being trade-in amounts can be used toward two payments. No action was done at this time.

Casey Erickson, RDO Equipment, met with the board to present trade-in values of the 1989 and 1985 motorgraders. A new JD 772CH motorgrader is priced at 164,975.00 with trade-in of 1989 motorgrader at \$37,500 and 1985 motorgrader at \$17,000.00 for a net amount of \$110,475.00. A 1998 JD 772CH motorgrader with 1,800 hours less 1989 and 1985 trade-in amounts would net at \$69,250.00. Another 1998 JD 772 CH motorgrader with 5,037 hours less 1989 and 1985 trade-in amounts would net at \$43,685.00. Payments can also start as far out to January 2004 or so being trade-in amounts can be used toward a couple of payments. Erickson was scheduled to return to the regular November 5th meeting at 2:30 p.m.

Sheriff, Larry Gessner, met again with the board to report on the painting estimates of the Ford Bronco. A tailgate is needed. Roger Tessman can pick a tailgate up at Fargo this weekend for \$300.00. The painting estimate is \$1,400.00 from Roger Tessman, Goodrich. Another painting estimate from Doug Helm will be received. It was moved by Commissioner Jorgensen to approve purchase of tailgate for the Ford Bronco in the amount \$300.00, seconded by Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote - Jorgensen yes, Felchle - yes All voting "yes" the motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
